## **JLL Mourns the Loss of Our Two Oldest Members**

Lansing has lost its two most senior members, sisters Beatrice O'Brien Herrmann Richards and Martha O'Brien Seaman. Bea died on March 29 at the age of 99 and Martha passed on May 11 at the age of 95. Bea and Martha moved to Lansing from New York in 1918 when their father became Assistant Sales Manager of Oldsmobile. Theirs was a prominent family and their father became Mayor of Lansing in 1941.

Beatrice "Bea" O'Brien Herrmann Richards graduated from Lansing Central high

School in 1928 and attended Michigan State University. Bea was a scholar and she brought Mortar Board to MSU. In 1931 she married H. Richard Herrmann, became active in the community and joined the Junior Service League which in 1948 became the Junior League of

Lansing. Bea also was a member of Sparrow Auxiliary and served as its President in 1954-55.

Susie Herrmann Brewster, a sustaining member of JLL, remembers that her mother loved Junior League and that her first placement was translating books to Braille for the blind. Susie remembers her mother working at the Thrift Shop on Washington Ave. Susie used to go and take her dolls and play in the dressing rooms. Bea's love of learning, books and children led her to a second degree in 1959 and a job in the Lansing School District as an elementary school librarian. She became friends with many children's book authors and illustrators, most notably Dr. Seuss, who wrote a special poem about her. Bea loved her family, had a ready smile, a positive view of life and she could talk to you

about the latest book, the newest fashion trend and who had won the latest MSU sporting event. Bea died on March 29, 2011 just six months short of her 100th birthday.

Martha O'Brien Seaman married John N. Seaman in 1937. John owned The Style Shop, a fashionable woman's clothing store in downtown Lansing. A vibrant couple, they helped to build many of Lansing's civic and cultural organizations and to develop its human service agencies. Martha's pattern was to begin work at the local level through neighborhood and civic community activities, especially those concerned with human welfare. Martha was President of the Lansing Junior League in 1951-52 and she served on the boards of the Lansing Mental Health Center, the Lansing Symphony, the East Lansing Downtown Development Committee and the Urban League. Her sensitivity, talents and intelligence led her to broader involvement on the regional and state levels. In recognition of her work, she received the 1963 Human Relations Award from B'nai B'rith and in 1969 she was honored by the Michigan Academy of Volunteer Leadership with a Certificate of Honor presented by Governor Milliken.

We are catalysts for lasting community change. We have been most successful at that when we remain true to who we are as an organization, true to our mission.

This coming year, as a membership, we will be reviewing and selecting a new signature project that we will provide funding and volunteers for until 2015. There has never been a better time for us to really look inside our organization, and really consider what makes us extraordinary. If we put all that we do up against our mission, we can't go wrong.





## **Community Response Grants**

ommunity Council is pleased to announce the final two Community Response Grants for 2010-2011. The Oldham Project Kourageous Kids will be receiving \$500. Kourageous Kids is a new program which allows families with children battling cancer to receive free portraitures. These portrait sessions will provide a fun and relaxing, interactive photo session where children can feel special for a short time and be a star, a fairy, or whatever they dream. Portraits will last for generations and provide a pleasant memory during a time of trial.

JLL will also be supporting MSU Community Music School again this year with \$250 to complete their initial request for \$750 of support. This funding will be used for financial aid to support low-income students seeking extracurricular music education or music therapy. The number of students

receiving financial aid at MSU CMS grew 35% in the past year from 102 students to 138 students. Research shows that participation in the arts can help students rise out of poverty by acquiring skills that lead to success in school and later work.

Please encourage organizations you know which are doing work consistent with our mission and focus area to look at the JLL website to learn about our Community Response Grant and determine if they should apply for the 2011-2012 fiscal year.
