This year's Kids in the Kitchen was a wonderful event held at Cavanaugh Elementary on May 20, 2017.

We again received a generous sponsorship from Jackson National Life.

We had a distinctly Junior League event that focused on our issue area—getting food into the hands of those who need it. We were able to do very targeted marketing putting our flyers into the Many Hands Weekend Survival Kits. The families that came were very appreciative of the experience.

The families and children who attended were able to plant their own lettuce (and some left with pumpkin seeds for home), learn about nutritious foods to eat, obtain information about the summer food programs offered in the area, learn how to make snacks of quesadillas and yogurt parfaits (each with only three ingredients), and have a lunch of freshly made vegetable chili. The chili was made in crockpots and the children learned how they could use an easy recipe like this to cook for their whole family in a kid-safe way. We also raffled off many prizes including crockpots!

We had a small crowd but nearly every family that attended went home with a crockpot for future meals.





The 2018 Kids in the Kitchen was partnered with Lansing Parks and Recreation to put on a group event titled the Food Fitness Fun Fair.

Nearly 100 children were brought by parents or guardians to the Gier Community Center on May 12 to participate in a range of healthy living activities. Event attendees were able to spend as much time as they pleased at stations that were set up in the gym and other rooms including fitness classes for kids (yoga, Zumba and cardio drumming), obstacle course, oral hygiene, food demonstrations, gardening, health and nutrition games, Lansing Fire and Police Department, and a community resources table. The kids were also excited to go home with raffle prizes such as cooking utensils, outdoor activities, gardening supplies and sports equipment to help motivate them to stay healthy and active.

The Kids in the Kitchen Committee (made up of both Provisional and Active members) along with Done in a Day volunteers all came together to make this successful community event possible!
